Cali explained that the lanyards say the same things as our rulers (Life's A Journey, Travel Drug Free). It was also reported that TRACC staff will have a presence at all Back to School Bash events that the coalition voted on to attend. Felicia Elzy reported to the coalition that she is having an additional back to school event in Ponchatoula at the Community Center on Friday, July 26th for anyone interested in attending.</p> <p>Taylor reported that TRACC staff will be there doing presentations and giving out information in their swag bags.</p> <p>Taylor reported that our Legislative Forum will replace our regularly scheduled TRACC meeting for August. The date of the Legislative Forum has moved to Tuesday, August 20, 2024 from 10:00am- 11:30am.</p> <p>Taylor reported that we have upcoming radio interviews July 31st and August 8th. Coalition members are invited to come.</p> <p>Bridget reported that we will have one focus group here in Hammond. We have at least 6 students signed up to attend. The second focus group will be held in Kentwood. We reached out to Mayor Irma Gordon to help us with a spot and to recruit students. She was able to recruit 6 additional students. The intent of the focus group is to ask the students what issues they are seeing in their schools. We are then hoping to have these students start up the KEYS Alliance group in their schools.</p> <p>Taylor reported that the committee has been working on the toolkit. We have interest at Kentwood High School and Hammond High School. We have gotten a bulk of the kit done. Taylor also asked the coalition if they are on the youth committee to please answer the survey so that we can see what date we can change the meeting to, to try and accommodate all members.</p> <p>Bridget reported that a good way for outreach for the coalition is to have a presence at our local high school football jamboree. The coalition has not had a presence in a while and wanted to bring this to the coalition to see if this would be a good idea. We would give out educational information and promote KEYS to the schools.</p> <p>Taylor reported that she will send out available dates to schedule a meeting.</p>
	<p><i>LHSC Grant Updates</i></p>	<p>Aaron reported that budgets are done and award letters are in process of being distributed. Bridget reported that the Community Development Department received their award letters for No Refusal, BRAKES, and SBIRT grants.</p>
	<p><i>Tangipahoa Parish Council- Kratom Ban Ordinance</i></p>	<p>Bridget reported that at the Parish Council meeting two weeks ago (July 8, 2024) the ordinance to ban Kratom was reintroduced. The Council heard from a TPSO narcotics officer, as well as a local Pharmacist who gave more information on what Kratom is. The Council will meet this upcoming Monday (July 22, 2024) to vote on the ordinance.</p>
